## **Galilee Church & Mosaics**

This year brought major discoveries in the Galilee region, a 1500year-old monastery was unearthed that had impeccably preserved mosaics that show beautiful images and records, including that women held a prominent position in the early church.

## **Copper Mines Dated to the Time of King Solomon**

Donkey dung found in Timna Valley at sites of abandoned mines were dated to be 3000 years old, bringing it directly into the time believed to have been when Kings David and Solomon ruled.

Purported Tomb of Christ Dated



Jerusalem's Church of the Holy Sepulchre has been through natural disasters and war, but it is believed by many to be the location of the tomb which Christ rose from the dead. Originally identified in approximately 325 AD by a Roman delegation, the church was destroyed around 1009 AD, leading many to believe that perhaps the location was no longer authentic to the Constantine Empire. In 2016, they opened the tomb for the first time, and scientific dating confirmed that the tomb was last opened squarely in the era.
